## GETTING STARTED

- Someone has said, "As go the leaders, so goes the church." Do you agree? Why or why not?

## LISTENING TO GOD'S WORD

- Read 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and make 7-10 observations on these verses. What stands out? What seems most important? Who is present? What commands are given? What do we learn about God?
- Compare and contrast the two lists of qualifications. What is similar? What is different?
- Read Acts 6:1:6. What is the situation the church is facing? If you insert yourself into that situation, what emotions do you think you would have experienced (in verse 1)?

How did the twelve apostles handle the situation? What was their strategy? What priorities guided their approach?

Acts 6:5 says this pleased the whole gathering. Would you have been pleased with this approach? Why or why not?

- Read Titus 1:5-9. This list is similar to the list for overseers in 1 Timothy 3. Why do you think these two lists focus so much on character and relational health rather than skills to master and tasks to perform?
- In your own words, how would you describe the two roles we've discussed in this study?

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## LIVING IT OUT

- When you look at the list of qualifications for overseers below, name one or two that catch your attention in this season of your life. Why do you think these seem important for both the health of a believer and the health of a church?
